UNPRECEDENTED RESSOURCES

300 M€ in 2024
in favor of athletes' performance
of which **114 M€**
by the Sport National Agency (ANS)

Since Rio 2016:

FOR THE ATHLETES

40,000€

minimum annual income for the 670 top French athletes embarked in the "cellules de performance"

17.3 M€

to support the income and academic and training opportunities for athletes

in professional / academic training since 2022 for more than 500 top athletes

6.9 M€

for individual sports preparation (mental and conditioning coaches, training courses)

500,000€

every year for parenting support for male and female athletes

More than 1,000

FOR THE COACHES

3.3 M€

additional compensation for coaches

dedicated to individual and collective support for coaches (trainings, seminars...)



A LONG TERM COMMITMENT

20 M€

for priority research programs, launched in 2019

for the "Sport Data Hub"

for digital transformation, aiming at strengthening the internal structure of federations since 2021, and enhancing the deployment of their data projects in the Sport Data Hub infrastructure

aiming at providing solutions for athletes where they locally train, with an allocation of 5M€ per year
